Preservation Capacity :

No. of Cabinets:

New Morgue: Morgue A, B and C (36in each) = **108 Cabinets**

Old Morgue: **28 cabinets.**

1 Mass disaster room: for usage only in case of mass disasters.

1 body parts room: for preservation of body parts only.

Charges

1. Private bodies: Rs. 100/ day
2. Non MLC Hospital Bodies : no charge for 1st two days then Rs. 50 per day.
3. Embalming of MLC Bodies done Rs. 1000/-

Laboratory investigations

1. Randox Evidence Investigator machine installed in the Department for toxicological analysis of poisonous substances and other narcotic and psychotropic drugs and common poisons.
2. Cases where in blood grouping is needed are referred to blood bank
3. MLC cases where histopathological analysis is needed, sample of organ duly sealed with filled histopathology forms are referred to Dept. of Pathology.
4. Viscera preserved in varied cases of suspected poisoning or drug overdose or materials preserved in hit and run motor vehicular cases or clinical forensic medicine cases are sent to forensic Science laboratory via Authorized Police personnel maintaining the chain of custody.
5. Blood sample is taken in a vial or FTA Card for DNA typing and further duly sealed and referred to CDFD or Specified Forensic Science Laboratory.
